BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 12 **Article - Natural Resources** 13 5-406. Any person who desires to cut down or trim any roadside tree shall apply 15 to the Department for a permit, except that: 16 [if] IF a tree is unrooted or its branches broken so as to contact (1) 17 telephone, telegraph, electric power, or other wires carrying electric current, or if the 18 tree or its branches endanger persons or property, the tree or its branches may be 19 removed without first obtaining a permit from the Department; [and] IF THE TREE OR ITS ROOTS ARE CAUSING ANY CURBING, STREET 20 (2) 21 SURFACE, OR SIDEWALK SURFACE TO BE UNEVEN, THE TREE MAY BE REMOVED 22 WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING A PERMIT FROM THE DEPARTMENT: AND 23 (3) [a] A tree standing within the right-of-way of a public road which 24 has not been surfaced with either stone, shell, gravel, concrete, brick, asphalt, or

25 other improved surface may be cut down and removed by the abutting landowner for

26 his own use without first obtaining a permit.

- 1 (b) A person may not cut down, trim, mutilate, or in any manner injure any 2 roadside tree, except as authorized by this section, without a permit from the
- 3 Department.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 5 October 1, 2000.
