HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 POW/MIA Recognition Day

- 3 FOR the purpose of recognizing the sacrifices of the United States armed forces
- personnel who are prisoners of war or listed as missing in action and that their
- 5 families are deserving of national recognition and support for continued priority
- 6 <u>efforts to determine the fate of those missing Americans</u>; and declaring the third
- 7 Friday of in September of each year to be "POW/MIA Recognition Day".
- 8 WHEREAS, The United States has fought in many wars and thousands of
- 9 Americans who served in those wars were captured by the enemy or listed as missing
- 10 in action; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Many of these Americans are still listed as missing and
- 12 unaccounted for, and the uncertainty surrounding their fates has caused their
- 13 families to suffer tragic and continuing hardships; and
- WHEREAS, In 1987, the United States Congress designated POW/MIA
- 15 Recognition Day as September 18th; and

- WHEREAS, No day is set aside in the State to recognize the prisoners of war and those listed as missing in action; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 4 General Assembly recognizes the sacrifices of Americans still missing and
- 5 unaccounted for from all of our Nation's wars and that their families are deserving of
- 6 national recognition and support for continued priority efforts to determine the fate of
- 7 those missing Americans; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly of Maryland hereby declares the third
- 9 Friday in September of each year to be "POW/MIA Recognition Day"; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 11 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 12 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
- 13 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
