## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

## 2 Promoting Environmental Justice in Zip Code 21226

- 3 FOR the purpose of urging the Department of the Environment, in consultation with
- 4 former members of the Advisory Council on Environmental Justice, to develop
- 5 and implement a plan to provide equal protection from environmental and
- 6 public health hazards for residents of zip code 21226; urging the Department of
- 7 the Environment to delineate specific areas of concern within zip code 21226
- 8 where certain activity should not take place due to environmental justice
- 9 concerns; urging the Department to include in its plan a statement of intent that
- 10 it will prohibit further issuance of certain environmental permits in areas
- designated by the Department as areas of concern in zip code 21226; and
- generally relating to environmental justice concerns in zip code 21226.
- 13 WHEREAS, "Environmental justice" means equal protection from
- 14 environmental and public health hazards for all people regardless of race, income,
- 15 culture, and social class; and
- WHEREAS, The State of Maryland has one of the highest cancer mortality rates
- 17 among states, ranking as seventh highest for cancer mortality; and
- 18 WHEREAS, A 1996 report by the Maryland Cancer Consortium found that from
- 19 1988 to 1992, Anne Arundel County had the highest cancer mortality rate of any
- 20 Maryland county west of Chesapeake Bay; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Anne Arundel County, located in the Baltimore Metropolitan
- 22 Statistic Area, is classified as being in severe nonattainment for ozone pollution; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The zip code of 21226 encompasses Northern Anne Arundel County
- 24 and Southern Baltimore City, and the residents in this area are exposed to a very high
- 25 concentration of chemicals due to the heavy industrial activity concentrated in this
- 26 area, and
- 27 WHEREAS, The demographics of zip code 21226 show that the residents in this
- 28 area are primarily low income residents; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The residents of zip code 21226 are continuously forced to accept
- 2 additional heavy industrial activity in this area due to the Department of the
- 3 Environment granting environmental permits for these facilities without regard to
- 4 environmental justice; now, therefore, be it
- 5 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 6 Department of the Environment, in consultation with former members of the
- 7 Advisory Council on Environmental Justice, should develop and implement a plan to
- 8 promote environmental justice for the area of zip code 21226; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Department of the Environment should delineate specific
- 10 areas of concern within zip code 21226 where additional or expanded industrial
- 11 activity should not take place due to environmental justice concerns; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the Department of the Environment include in its plan a
- 13 statement of intent that it will prohibit further issuance of environmental permits for
- 14 industrial facilities in designated areas of concern in zip code 21226; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 16 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 17 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
- 18 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
