HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 Task Force to Study Establishing a Matthew Henson Memorial

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study Establishing a Matthew
- 4 Henson Memorial; providing for the membership of the Task Force; providing for
- 5 the duties of the Task Force; providing for a certain report; and generally
- 6 relating to a Task Force to Study Establishing a Matthew Henson Memorial.
- WHEREAS, Matthew Henson, an African American, was born in Charles
- 8 County in 1866; and
- 9 WHEREAS, At the age of 12, Matthew Henson, was sent to sea where he
- 10 learned mathematics, navigation, how to read, and most importantly, how to read
- 11 maps; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Matthew Henson and Lt. Robert E. Peary traveled seven times to
- 13 the Arctic on dangerous and difficult expeditions, and as a result Mr. Henson became
- 14 a superior dogsled driver and hunter and an expert at survival; and
- WHEREAS, On April 6, 1909, Lt. Peary, Matthew Henson, and four Inuit
- 16 Eskimos reached the Arctic with Matthew Henson arriving well ahead of the others
- 17 making him the first person to reach the North Pole; and
- WHEREAS, This significant achievement of Matthew Henson's, including his
- 19 trek over 400 miles to stand at the axis of the world, went unrecognized for over 20
- 20 years due to the color of his skin; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Eventually Matthew Henson's accomplishment was acknowledged
- 22 through the receipt of several honorary degrees and the dedication of a glacier, a
- 23 gymnasium, a middle school, a stamp, a State park, and even an oceanographic ship
- 24 after him: and
- 25 WHEREAS, The people of Maryland would like to recognize the magnificent
- 26 contributions of Matthew Henson, a native Marylander, by erecting a memorial to
- 27 honor him; now, therefore, be it

- 1 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the 2 General Assembly and Governor establish a Task Force to Study Establishing a Matthew Henson Memorial; and be it further 4 RESOLVED, That the Task Force be composed of: 5 One member who is a representative of the Maryland Historical 6 Trust selected by the Director of the Maryland Historical Trust; 7 One member who is a representative of the Maryland Commission on 8 African American History and Culture selected by the Chairman of the Commission; One member who is a representative of the Charles County Planning 10 Commission selected by the Chairman of the Commission; and Four members who are citizens from Charles County who have 12 demonstrated an interest in establishing a Matthew Henson Memorial to be selected 13 by the members of the State Senate and House of Delegates who represent any part of 14 Charles County; and be it further 15 RESOLVED, That the Task Force study: An appropriate memorial to commemorate the achievements of 16 (1) 17 Matthew Henson; 18 (2) An appropriate site for the Matthew Henson Memorial; and 19 (3) The costs associated with establishing a Matthew Henson Memorial; 20 and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations 21
- 22 to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to
- 23 the General Assembly by December 31, 2000; and be it further;
- 24 RESOLVED. That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 25 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 26 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
- 27 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
