## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

- 2 Creation of a U.S. Space and Flight Center in Maryland
- 3 FOR the purpose of requesting the Maryland Delegation to Congress to actively
- advocate and seek private sector, State, and federal support, including funding, 4
- 5 for a site in Maryland to be designated as a U.S. Space and Flight Center, and
- for the planning, design, and development of a space and flight center in Prince 6
- 7 George's County, Maryland stating that there is the need for a U.S. Space and
- Flight Center to be established in Prince George's County, Maryland in 8
- conjunction with the Goddard Space Flight Center and Andrews Air Force Base; 9
- 10 and urging the Maryland Delegation to Congress to seek federal support for the
- 11 establishment of the U.S. Space and Flight Center and the cooperation of the
- 12 Goddard Space Flight Center and Andrews Air Force Base.
- 13 WHEREAS, Maryland has two major space and flight facilities that are of great
- 14 importance to the economy and security of the nation, to the advancement of
- 15 knowledge, and to the quality of life and well-being of the American people; and
- 16 WHEREAS, These two facilities are the Goddard Space Flight Center and
- 17 Andrews Air Force Base, home of Air Force One; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The time is right for Maryland to more fully utilize these assets to
- 19 educate and inspire our youth, their teachers, and their parents and to attract visitors
- 20 and realize the economic benefits from these assets; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Other states have developed space centers and space camps in
- 22 conjunction with NASA facilities in their states, and have demonstrated the great
- 23 interest the American people have in visiting and learning more about our space
- 24 programs, their history, and their potential; and

- WHEREAS, Maryland has one of the oldest NASA facilities in the nation, and
- 2 Goddard has developed such outstanding technological advances as the implantable
- 3 cardioverter defibrillator, Earth Alert, Weather Anywhere, and the LIDAR
- 4 topographical mapping system; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Other flight museums have obtained decommissioned Air Force
- 6 One airplanes and other high-profile airplanes to create air museums and other
- 7 tourist attractions, but Maryland is the home of Air Force One; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Maryland is home of the College Park airport, which is the oldest
- 9 continuously active airport in the world, site of the first military flight training
- 10 conducted by one of the Wright brothers, and the home of many other historic planes
- 11 that are on display at nearby Smithsonian locations making Maryland a premier
- 12 center for flight history, education, and tourism; and
- WHEREAS, Andrews Air Force Base is also the airport used by the President of
- 14 the United States and other high-ranking United States officials and visiting
- 15 dignitaries from all over the world as they travel in and out of Washington, D.C.; and
- WHEREAS, Most residents of Maryland have never visited either the Goddard
- 17 Space Flight Center or Andrews Air Force Base, and most visitors to the Nation's
- 18 Capitol do not include these Maryland attractions in their itinerary; and
- 19 WHEREAS, With the creation of a <u>U.S.</u> Space and Flight Center, highly visible
- 20 and easily accessible from the Capital Beltway, tourists from all over the country
- 21 could be attracted to Maryland to visit the <u>U.S.</u> Space and Flight Center, and students
- 22 from throughout the State could take advantage of the unique educational
- 23 opportunities that a space camp serving in conjunction with Goddard Space Flight
- 24 Center and Andrews Air Force Base would provide; now, therefore, be it
- 25 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That there is
- 26 the need for a U.S. Space and Flight Center to be established in Prince George's
- 27 County, Maryland in conjunction with the Goddard Space Flight Center and Andrews
- 28 Air Force Base; and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the Maryland Delegation to Congress be is urged to seek
- 30 federal support for the establishment of such a space camp a U.S. Space and Flight
- 31 Center, including funding for the planning, design, and development of the Center,
- 32 and the cooperation of NASA and Goddard the Goddard Space Flight Center and
- 33 Andrews Air Force Base; and be it further
