HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 Federal Funding to Students With Disabilities

- 3 FOR the purpose of requesting the United States Congress to honor its commitment
- 4 to fund educational programs for students with disabilities.
- 5 WHEREAS, The federal government committed to funding 40% of the costs of
- 6 educating students with disabilities; and
- WHEREAS, Federal funding currently provides only 11% of the cost of
- 8 educating students with disabilities; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Maryland and most other states must shift existing state funds
- 10 from other programs or allocate new funds to ensure that all students with
- 11 disabilities receive the education and services to which they are entitled; and
- WHEREAS, The National Governor's Association in March, 1999, called upon
- 13 Congress to meet its special education funding commitment to students with
- 14 disabilities; now, therefore, be it
- 15 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the United
- 16 States Congress is requested to honor its commitment to fund the special education
- 17 needs of students with disabilities; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That the United States Congress is encouraged to fully fund
- 19 special education grants to all states and special education programs in federal
- 20 schools; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 22 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 23 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
- 24 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
