A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Judgeships - Circuit Courts and District Court**

3 FOR the purpose of increasing the number of judges authorized for Circuits 1, 3, 5, 6,  
4 7, and 8 (Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Montgomery, Prince George's, and Worcester  
5 counties and Baltimore City); increasing the number of associate judges of the  
6 District Court in District 4 and providing for the effective date of this Act.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

9 Section 1-503(a)(2), (3), (15), (16), and (23) and (b) and 1-603(b)

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

20 1-503.

21 (a) In each county in the first seven judicial circuits there shall be the number  
22 of resident judges of the circuit court set forth below, including the judge or judges  
23 provided for by the Constitution:

24 (2) Anne Arundel .....[10] 11

25 (3) Baltimore County.....[16] 17

.....

1 (15) Montgomery .....[17] 18

2 (16) Prince George's.....[23] 24

3 (23) Worcester ..... [2] 3

4 (b) In Baltimore City there shall be [30] 31 resident judges of the Circuit  
5 Court for Baltimore City.

6 1-602.

7 For the purposes of operation and administration of the District Court, the State  
8 is divided into the following districts:

- 9 (1) District 1 -- Baltimore City.
- 10 (2) District 2 -- Dorchester, Wicomico, Somerset, and Worcester  
11 Counties.
- 12 (3) District 3 -- Caroline, Talbot, Queen Anne's, Kent, and Cecil  
13 Counties.
- 14 (4) District 4 -- Charles, St. Mary's, and Calvert Counties.
- 15 (5) District 5 -- Prince George's County.
- 16 (6) District 6 -- Montgomery County.
- 17 (7) District 7 -- Anne Arundel County.
- 18 (8) District 8 -- Baltimore County.
- 19 (9) District 9 -- Harford County.
- 20 (10) District 10 -- Howard and Carroll Counties.
- 21 (11) District 11 -- Frederick and Washington Counties.
- 22 (12) District 12 -- Allegany and Garrett Counties.

23 1-603.

24 (b) In each of the districts provided for in § 1-602 of this subtitle, there shall  
25 be the following number of associate judges of the District Court:

- 26 (1) District 1 -- 26
- 27 (2) District 2 -- 5, two to be appointed from Wicomico County
- 28 (3) District 3 -- 6, two to be appointed from Cecil County
- 29 (4) District 4 -- [4] 5, two to be appointed from Charles County

2           (6)     District 6 -- 13

3           (7)     District 7 -- 8

4           (8)     District 8 -- 13

5           (9)     District 9 -- 4

6           (10)    District 10 -- 7, two to be appointed from Carroll County and five to  
7 be appointed from Howard County

8           (11)    District 11 -- 5, three to be appointed from Frederick County and two  
9 to be appointed from Washington County

10          (12)    District 12 -- 3, two to be appointed from Allegany County

11       SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
12 July 1, 2000.
