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## **County Boards of Elections - Employee Grievances**

3 FOR the purpose of providing that certain county boards of elections shall be the

4 principal unit in certain employee grievance matters; and generally relating to

5 personnel matters at certain county boards of elections.

## 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 Article - State Personnel and Pensions

14 1-101.

15 (a) In this Division I of this article the following words have the meanings 16 indicated.

17 (b) "Appointing authority" means an individual or a unit of government that18 has the power to make appointments and terminate employment.

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1 (c) "Class" means a category of one or more similar positions, as established 2 by the Secretary in accordance with this article.

3 (d) "Contractual employee" means an individual described in § 13-101 of this 4 article.

5 (e) "County" means a county of this State and, unless expressly provided 6 otherwise, Baltimore City.

7 (f) Unless expressly provided otherwise, "Department" means the8 Department of Budget and Management.

9 (g) "Executive service" means the employment category in the State Personnel 10 Management System that is described in § 6-404 of this article.

(h) "Management service" means the employment category in the StatePersonnel Management System that is described in § 6-403 of this article.

(i) (1) "Person" means an individual, receiver, trustee, guardian, personal
representative, fiduciary, or representative of any kind and any partnership, firm,
association, corporation, or other entity.

16 (2) Unless expressly provided otherwise, "person" does not include a 17 governmental entity or a unit or instrumentality of a governmental entity.

(j) "Position" means an employment assignment of duties and responsibilities
that requires the full-time employment of one individual or less than full-time
employment of one or more individuals.

21 (k) "Principal unit" means:

22 (1) a principal department or other principal independent unit of State 23 government[.]; OR

24 (2) FOR AN EMPLOYEE OF A COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS WHOSE
25 EMPLOYEES ARE COVERED BY THIS ARTICLE, THE COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS.

(l) "Professional service" means the employment category in the StatePersonnel Management System that is described in § 6-402 of this article.

28 (m) "Secretary" means the Secretary of Budget and Management.

29 (n) "Skilled service" means the employment category in the State Personnel
30 Management System that is described in § 6-401 of this article.

31 (o) "State" means:

32 (1) a state, possession, territory, or commonwealth of the United States;

33 or

34 (2) the District of Columbia.

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1 (p) "State Personnel Management System" means the personnel system 2 established under § 6-101 of this article.

- 3 (q) "Temporary employee" includes:
- 4 (1) a contractual employee; and
- 5 (2) an emergency employee.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 7 effect October 1, 2000.
