8 effect July 1, 1998. [It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of

9 June 30, 2002, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall

12 Education Commission shall periodically review the unrestricted grants authorized

13 under this Act to determine whether the unrestricted grants are appropriate in light

14 of: (i) the amount of funding that each community college receives under the John A.

15 Cade Funding Formula established under § 16-305 of the Education Article; (ii) the

16 amount of funding that each community college receives from the county; (iii) the

17 amount of funding that each community college receives from any other source,

18 including tuition and fees; (iv) the number of full-time equivalent students attending

19 the community college; and (v) any other relevant factor, as determined by the

20 Commission.
