- 4 Standard Pay Plan may be granted only if employees meet certain performance

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article State Personnel and Pensions
- 15 8-107.
- 16 (a) This section applies only to employees whose positions are in the Standard 17 Pay Plan.
- 18 (b) An employee in the Standard Pay Plan shall be denied a pay increase in 19 any year if:
- 20 (1) an appointing authority has imposed the denial as a disciplinary
- 21 action under Title 11, Subtitle 1 of this article; or
- 22 (2) the appointing authority denies the increase because of:
- 23 (i) an extension of an employee's period of probation under § 7-403
- 24 of this article;
- 25 (ii) lack of productivity; or

- 1 (iii) excessive, unexcused absenteeism. 2 (c) An employee may [not be denied a pay increase for reasons of performance 3 that adversely affects the value of the employee to this State unless substantial 4 reasons of performance were cited on the employee's midyear or final performance 5 appraisal forms.] BE GRANTED A PAY INCREASE ONLY WHEN THE EMPLOYEE 6 RECEIVES A MIDYEAR OR END-OF-CYCLE PERFORMANCE EVALUATION RATING OF: 7 OUTSTANDING; (1) 8 (2) EXCEEDS STANDARDS; OR 9 (3) MEETS STANDARDS. 10 (D) THE PERFORMANCE EVALUATION USED TO DETERMINE WHETHER AN 11 EMPLOYEE MAY BE GRANTED A PAY INCREASE SHALL BE THE EVALUATION 12 IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE EMPLOYEE'S PAY
- 14 [(d)] (E) An employee who is denied a pay increase under this section may 15 appeal the denial under the appeal procedures for disciplinary actions in Title 11 of 16 this article.
- 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 July 1, 2000.
