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A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City - Board of Liquor License Commissioners - Health Benefits**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that the chairman and other members of the Baltimore  
4 City Board of Liquor License Commissioners receive certain health benefits; and  
5 generally relating to the Baltimore City Board of Liquor License  
6 Commissioners.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
8 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages  
9 Section 15-109(d)  
10 Annotated Code of Maryland  
11 (1998 Replacement Volume and 1999 Supplement)

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

15 15-109.

16 (d) In Baltimore City:

17 (1) The chairman of the Board shall receive an annual salary of \$18,500,  
18 and the other members of the Board shall receive an annual salary of \$18,000.

19 (2) THE CHAIRMAN AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE BOARD SHALL  
20 RECEIVE THE HEALTH BENEFITS THAT ARE AWARDED TO MEMBERS OF THE CITY  
21 UNION OF BALTIMORE.

22 (3) The Board shall appoint an executive secretary and a deputy  
23 executive secretary whose salaries shall be fixed by the Board, subject to approval by  
24 the State Comptroller.

25 [(3)] (4) The executive secretary and the deputy executive secretary  
26 shall be residents of Baltimore City and of high character and integrity.

1            [(4)]    (5)        The executive secretary and the deputy executive secretary  
2 shall be appointed upon the basis of their executive skill and ability and once  
3 appointed shall hold office during good behavior regardless of changes in members  
4 constituting the Board. They shall be removed only for incompetency or immorality  
5 upon charges furnished in writing by the Board setting forth the grounds for  
6 dismissal and after opportunity for hearing.

7            [(5)]    (6)        Either the executive secretary or the deputy executive secretary  
8 shall be a member of the Bar of this State.

9        SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
10 October 1, 2000.
