- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 20 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages
- 21 10-503.
- In this section, "board" means the board of license commissioners or 22 (1)
- 23 liquor control board, as the case may be, of the county or Baltimore City.
- 24 (d) (1) This subsection applies only in Baltimore City.
- 25 A transfer of any license may only be made as authorized in (2)
- 26 subsection (a) of this section if the Board has presented to it a receipt or certificate
- 27 from the Director of Finance showing there are no unpaid taxes on the merchandise,

  3 (3) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the fee for
  4 transfer or assignment of a license is \$100 in addition to the cost of publication and
  5 notice and any hearing fees required.
  6 (ii) A Class C licensee may transfer or assign one license during a
  7 license year without paying a fee.
  8 (4) A TRANSFER OF ANY LICENSE SHALL BE COMPLETED NOT MORE
  9 THAN 180 DAYS AFTER THE BOARD APPROVES THE TRANSFER.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 October 1, 2000.
