A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages - Notice of License Renewal Hearing

- 3 FOR the purpose of allowing the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for
- 4 Baltimore City to refrain from giving public notice before conducting a hearing
- 5 on a license renewal application against which a protest has been filed; and
- 6 generally relating to license renewal hearings conducted by the Board of Liquor
- 7 License Commissioners for Baltimore City.
- 8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 9 Article 2B Alcoholic Beverages
- 10 Section 10-301(a)(1)
- 11 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 12 (1998 Replacement Volume and 1999 Supplement)
- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 15 Article 2B Alcoholic Beverages

- 17 (a) (I) Except in Prince George's County, the holder of any expiring
- 18 license, other than special licenses issued under the provisions of this article, shall,
- 19 not less than 30 nor more than 60 days before the first day of May of each and every
- 20 year, file a written application, duly verified by oath, for the renewal of the license
- 21 with the official authorized to approve the same. The renewal application shall state
- 22 that the facts in the original application are unchanged. It shall be accompanied by a
- 23 statement signed by the owner of the premises consenting to renewal of the license
- 24 and to search and seizure as in the case of original applications. In the case of retail
- 25 dealers applying for renewal, the statement of consent by the owner of the premises
- 26 may not be required if the owner has previously signed such a statement in
- 27 connection with an original application or previous renewal application giving
- 28 consent for the term of the owner's lease with the applicant if the lease or renewal
- 29 does not expire during the term of the renewal license. Upon the filing of the renewal
- 30 application, and upon payment of the annual fee, the holder of the expiring license is

- 1 entitled to a new license for another year without the filing of further statements or
- 2 the furnishing of any further information unless specifically requested by the official
- 3 authorized to approve the license.
- 4 (II) A license by way of renewal may not be approved without a
- 5 hearing before such official if a protest has been filed against the granting of the new
- 6 license at least 30 days before the expiration of the license for which renewal is
- 7 sought. This protest shall be [(i)]1. signed by not less than ten residents or real estate
- 8 owners in the immediate vicinity in which the licensed place of business is located; or
- 9 [(ii)] 2. instituted by the board of licensing commissioners on its own initiative. If the
- 10 protest has been filed it shall be heard and determined as in the case of original
- 11 applications, except in Baltimore City it shall be heard and determined not as in the
- 12 case of original application in regard to zoning but only on a specific complaint as to
- 13 the operation of the licensee's establishments.
- 14 (III) IN BALTIMORE CITY, THE BOARD OF LIQUOR LICENSE
- 15 COMMISSIONERS NEED NOT GIVE PUBLIC NOTICE BEFORE CONDUCTING A HEARING

- 18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 19 October 1, 2000.
