2 (a) In this section, "offense" means A LICENSE RESTRICTION VIOLATION
3 UNDER § 16-113(D) OR (D-1) OF THIS TITLE OR a moving violation committed by an
4 individual who:

5 (1) Holds a provisional license under § 16-111 of this title; and

6 (2) Was convicted of the violation.

7 (b) The sanctions under this section are in addition to any other penalty or 8 sanctions that might apply as a result of a moving violation.

9 (c) The Administration:

10 (1) For a first offense, shall require the offender to attend a driver 11 improvement program under § 16-212 of this subtitle;

12 (2) For a second offense, may suspend the offender's provisional license 13 for up to 30 days; and

14 (3) For a third or subsequent offense, may suspend or revoke the 15 offender's provisional license for up to 180 days.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding Section

17 1 of this Act, any individual who holds a provisional driver's license on September 30,

18 2000, is subject to the license restrictions in effect on that date as long as the

19 provisional license remains in effect and is not affected by the changes in restrictions

20 applicable to provisional licenses enacted under Section 1 of this Act.

21 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 October 1, 2000.
