

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 13 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 14 12-302. 15 Unless provision is made elsewhere, the following provisions apply (a) statewide to persons who are employed in licensed establishments: 17 (1) A person under age 18 may not be engaged in the sale of alcoholic 18 beverages. 19 Except for Class D beer, wine and liquor licensees as provided in 20 paragraph (3) of this subsection, a person between ages 18 and 21 may be employed in 21 the sale of beer and light wine. A person under age 21 may not be employed by any holder of a Class 22 23 D beer, wine and liquor license in the sale of alcoholic beverages.
