A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **eMaryland Initiative**

3 FOR the purpose of creating the CEO Board of Advisors for E-Commerce in State
4 government; providing for the membership and structure of the Board;
5 specifying the duties of the Board; providing for staff support for the Board;
6 establishing a consortium at the University of Maryland College Park to
7 promote the deployment of Internet-based technologies; providing for the
8 purpose, role, and charge of the consortium; creating a management committee
9 of the consortium; providing for the role and membership of the management
10 committee; establishing an application service provider account in the
11 Information Technology Investment Fund; providing for expenditures from the
12 account for certain purposes; specifying what moneys may constitute the
13 account; defining certain terms; and generally relating to initiatives to advance
14 the development, promotion, and use of electronic commerce in the State.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That Section(s) 7-316(m) and (n), respectively, of Article - State
15 Finance and Procurement of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be
16 Section(s) 7-316(n) and (o), respectively.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland
18 read as follows:

19 **Article - State Government**

20 **SUBTITLE 22. BOARD OF ADVISORS FOR ELECTRONIC COMMERCE.**

22 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
23 INDICATED.

24 (B) "APPLICATION SERVICE PROVIDER" MEANS THE DEPLOYMENT OF
25 BUSINESS SOFTWARE APPLICATIONS AND SERVICES OVER THE INTERNET.

26 (C) "ASP" MEANS APPLICATION SERVICE PROVIDER.

27 (D) "BOARD" MEANS THE CEO BOARD OF ADVISORS FOR E-COMMERCE.

28 (E) "CONSORTIUM" MEANS THE "EMARYLAND" ASP CONSORTIUM.

29 (F) "E-COMMERCE" MEANS ELECTRONIC BUSINESS AND COMMERCE.

31 THE CEO BOARD OF ADVISORS FOR E-COMMERCE AND THE "EMARYLAND" ASP
32 CONSORTIUM ARE ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE TO ASSIST IN THE STATE'S
33 EFFORTS TO CREATE THE MOST ADVANCED ELECTRONIC BUSINESS ENVIRONMENT

1 IN THE NATION AND BECOME AN INTERNATIONAL LEADER IN THE DEPLOYMENT OF
2 NEW INTERNET TECHNOLOGIES.

3 9-2203.

4 (A) THERE IS A CEO BOARD OF ADVISORS FOR E-COMMERCE IN STATE
5 GOVERNMENT.

6 (B) (1) THE BOARD MAY NOT EXCEED 12 MEMBERS AND SHALL BE
7 APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE
8 AND SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE GOVERNOR.

9 (2) EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD SERVES FOR A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS
10 AND MAY BE REAPPOINTED.

11 (3) THE GOVERNOR SHALL DESIGNATE TWO REPRESENTATIVES OF
12 STATE GOVERNMENT TO SERVE AS EX OFFICIO MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

13 (4) THE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR SHALL BE INDUSTRY
14 LEADERS WHO HAVE SUBSTANTIAL EXPERIENCE AND EXPERTISE IN ELECTRONIC
15 COMMERCE.

16 (5) THE GOVERNOR SHALL DESIGNATE A CHAIRMAN OR COCHAIRMAN
17 FROM AMONG THE MEMBERS.

18 (6) THE BOARD SHALL MEET AT LEAST TWICE ANNUALLY.

19 (C) THE BOARD SHALL:

20 (1) ADVISE THE GOVERNOR ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT POLICIES
21 AND INITIATIVES TO ADVANCE THE PROMOTION, DEPLOYMENT, AND USE OF
22 E-COMMERCE IN THE STATE;

23 (2) RECOMMEND WAYS TO IMPROVE THE STATE'S POSITION AS AN
24 INTERNATIONAL LEADER OF E-COMMERCE; AND

25 (3) PROVIDE POLICY GUIDANCE TO THE "EMARYLAND" ASP
26 CONSORTIUM AND RELATED ASP INITIATIVES.

27 (D) A MEMBER OF THE BOARD MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A
28 MEMBER BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE
29 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

30 (E) THE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT AND UNIVERSITY OF
31 MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK SHALL PROVIDE STAFF SUPPORT TO THE BOARD.

33 (A) THERE IS AN "EMARYLAND" ASP CONSORTIUM AT THE UNIVERSITY OF
34 MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK.

1 (B) (1) THE CONSORTIUM SHALL HAVE THE GENERAL PURPOSE OF
2 PROMOTING THE DEPLOYMENT OF INTERNET-BASED TECHNOLOGIES IN
3 MARYLAND.

4 (2) THE CONSORTIUM SHALL DEVELOP STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS
5 WITH THE STATE, INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, FEDERAL AGENCIES, AND
6 WORLD CLASS TECHNOLOGY COMPANIES TO CARRY OUT ITS MISSION.

7 (3) THE CONSORTIUM SHALL:

8 (I) DEVELOP PILOT MODELS FOR THE DEPLOYMENT OF
9 INTERNET-BASED APPLICATIONS FOR GOVERNMENT AND EDUCATIONAL
10 INSTITUTIONS, SUCH AS PROCUREMENT, FINANCIAL, AND HUMAN RESOURCE
11 MANAGEMENT APPLICATIONS;

12 (II) PARTICIPATE IN COLLABORATIONS TO PROMOTE THE
13 DEVELOPMENT AND TESTING OF ASP TECHNOLOGIES IN MARYLAND;

14 (III) PROVIDE ADVICE AND ASSISTANCE TO SMALL START-UP
15 COMPANIES WISHING TO UTILIZE ASP TECHNOLOGIES; AND

16 (IV) WORK WITH INDUSTRY AND PUBLIC AGENCIES TO RESEARCH
17 AND DEVELOP EMERGING E-COMMERCE TECHNOLOGIES.

18 (C) (1) THERE IS A MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE OF THE CONSORTIUM.

19 (2) THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR APPROVING
20 THE ACTIVITIES OF THE CONSORTIUM AND PROVIDING DIRECTION AND OVERSIGHT.

21 (3) THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE SHALL BE COMPOSED OF:

22 (I) THE CHIEF OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY OF THE STATE OF
23 MARYLAND;

24 (II) THE CHIEF INFORMATION OFFICER AT THE UNIVERSITY OF
25 MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK;

26 (III) THE DIRECTOR OF THE SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT CENTER
27 AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK;

28 (IV) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MARYLAND SCIENCE,
29 ENGINEERING, AND TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION; AND

30 (V) A MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR.

33 (b) There is an Information Technology Investment Fund.

1 (I) Subject to the provisions of subsection [(m)] (N) of this section and except
2 for the cost incurred in administering the Fund, the Fund may be used for:

- 3 (1) educationally related information technology projects; [and]
4 (2) State information technology projects, including:
5 (i) pilots;
6 (ii) prototypes;
7 (iii) kiosk systems;
8 (iv) graphical user interface for citizen access to governmental
9 services;
10 (v) document imaging systems;
11 (vi) State and campuswide networks; and
12 (vii) the Maryland electronic capital; AND

13 (3) APPLICATION SERVICE PROVIDER INITIATIVES AS PROVIDED FOR IN
14 § 9-2204 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.

15 (M) (1) THERE IS AN APPLICATION SERVICE PROVIDER ACCOUNT IN THE
16 FUND.

17 (2) THE ACCOUNT CONSISTS OF:

18 (I) MONEYS DEDICATED FROM THE FUND FOR APPLICATION
19 SERVICE PROVIDER INITIATIVES;

20 (II) MONEYS RECEIVED AS A DIRECT RESULT OF APPLICATION
21 SERVICE PROVIDER PROJECTS, INCLUDING REIMBURSEMENTS, REPAYMENTS,
22 INTEREST, OR OTHER REVENUE; AND

23 (III) MONEYS MADE AVAILABLE TO THE ACCOUNT THROUGH
24 APPROPRIATE FEDERAL PROGRAMS OR PRIVATE CONTRIBUTIONS.

25 (3) DISBURSEMENTS FROM THE ACCOUNT SHALL BE MADE IN
26 ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTIONS (J) AND (K) OF THIS SECTION.

27 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
28 July 1, 2000.
