2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of**  
3 **2000, the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1992, 1994, 1996,**  
4 **1997, 1998, and 1999, and the General Construction Loan of 1982**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Four~~  
6 ~~Hundred Thirty Eight Million, Six Hundred Eighteen Thousand Dollars~~  
7 ~~(\$438,618,000) Four Hundred Thirty Two Million, Three Hundred Forty Three~~  
8 ~~Thousand Dollars (\$432,343,000) Four Hundred Twenty Seven Million, Five~~  
9 ~~Hundred Ninety Three Thousand Dollars (\$427,593,000) Four Hundred~~

12 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and

15 subject to the requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching funds  
16 of a certain type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale  
17 of bonds evidencing the loan; providing for certain unexpended appropriations

23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
 24 MARYLAND, That:

25 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
 26 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
 27 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2000 in the total principal amount of ~~\$438,618,000~~  
 28 ~~\$432,343,000~~ ~~\$427,593,000~~ \$428,623,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the  
 29 issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a  
 30 resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance  
 31 with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and  
 32 Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

33 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as  
 34 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement  
 35 Article.

36 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
 37 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
 38 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then

1 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
2 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable  
3 architects' and engineers' fees:

 23 Act, the agency or institution shall provide satisfactory evidence to the Board of  
 24 Public Works that the work described in the individual item can be completed with  
 25 the funds specified for that item.

26 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval of the  
 27 Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation under the provisions of  
 28 this Act that is in excess of the amount needed for a project may be credited to the  
 29 Construction Contingency Fund under § 3-609 of the State Finance and Procurement  
 30 Article.

31 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if federal funds are  
 32 available to help accomplish any project identified in this Act, the State agency or  
 33 institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper  
 34 administrative procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds  
 35 appropriated by this Act, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board  
 36 of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal  
 37 funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in  
 38 this Act and not to expand its scope.

39 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

40 (a) for any appropriation for the planning of a State-owned project provided in  
 41 this Act, if a program required by § 3-602(d) of the State Finance and Procurement  
 42 Article has not been submitted, the State agency or institution responsible for the

1 project shall submit a program to the Department of Budget and Management for  
2 approval before funds may be expended from the appropriation; and

3 (b) for any appropriation for the construction of a State-owned project  
4 provided in this Act, if preliminary plans and outline specifications required by §  
5 3-602(f)(2)(i) of the State Finance and Procurement Article have not been prepared,  
6 the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall submit preliminary  
7 plans and outline specifications to the Department of Budget and Management for  
8 approval before funds may be expended from the appropriation.

9 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That no portion of the  
10 proceeds of a loan or any of the matching funds provided for a project funded under  
11 this Act may be used for the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction, or in  
12 connection with the design, acquisition, construction, or equipping of any building  
13 used or to be used as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction, or in  
14 connection with any program or department of divinity for any religious  
15 denomination. Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, a recipient of the  
16 proceeds of a loan under this Act shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that  
17 none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching funds has been or is being used for  
18 a purpose prohibited by this Act.

19 SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

20 (a) the Comptroller may advance funds from any loan fund account to any  
21 other loan fund account established pursuant to a general obligation bond loan  
22 enabling act, under the authority of which general obligation bonds have been issued,  
23 for any expenditure authorized by that act; and

24 (b) with the approval of the Board of Public Works, the Comptroller may  
25 advance funds to any loan fund account established pursuant to a general obligation  
26 bond loan enabling act, for which an approving legal opinion has been received by the  
27 Board, for any expenditure authorized by that act, provided that the next ensuing  
28 sale of general obligation bonds shall include the issuance of bonds under the  
29 authority of that act in an amount at least equivalent to the amount of the funds so  
30 advanced.

31 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the net new debt to be  
32 authorized by legislation in fiscal year 2001 may not exceed \$460,000,000, as  
33 evidenced by the following:
