12 of a certain type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale

13 of bonds evidencing the loan; providing for certain unexpended appropriations

14 in prior capital budget and bond loan acts to be expended for other public

15 projects; altering certain requirements for certain programs in prior capital

16 budget acts; providing that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior

17 capital budget and bond loan acts be reduced by certain amounts; and generally

4 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as 5 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement 6 Article.

7 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer 8 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and 9 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then 10 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the 11 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable 12 architects' and engineers' fees:
