5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Four~~  
6 ~~Hundred Thirty-Eight Million, Six Hundred Eighteen Thousand Dollars~~  
7 ~~(\$438,618,000)~~ Four Hundred Thirty-Two Million, Three Hundred Forty-Three  
8 Thousand Dollars (\$432,343,000) the proceeds to be used for certain necessary  
9 building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion,  
10 replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring  
11 certain real estate and for grants to certain subdivisions and other organizations  
12 for certain purposes, subject to the requirement that certain grantees provide  
13 certain matching funds of a certain type by a certain date; providing generally  
14 for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan; providing for certain  
15 unexpended appropriations in prior capital budget and bond loan acts to be  
16 expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for certain  
17 programs in prior capital budget acts; providing that the authorizations of State  
18 Debt in certain prior capital budget and bond loan acts be reduced by certain  
19 amounts; and generally relating to the financing of certain capital projects.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
7 MARYLAND, That:

8 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
9 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
10 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2000 in the total principal amount of ~~\$438,618,000~~  
11 \$432,343,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State  
12 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and  
13 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the  
14 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

15 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as  
16 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement  
17 Article.

18 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
19 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
20 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
21 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
22 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable  
23 architects' and engineers' fees:
