- 33 (2) THE CERTIFIED INDUSTRIAL HYGIENIST DESIGNATION HAS NOT

- 3 (1) THE INDIVIDUAL IS DESIGNATED AS AN INDUSTRIAL HYGIENIST IN
- 4 TRAINING BY THE AMERICAN BOARD OF INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE OR ANOTHER
- 5 ORGANIZATION THAT MAINTAINS CERTIFICATION ELIGIBILITY, EXAMINATION
- 6 REQUIREMENTS, AND A CODE OF ETHICS THAT ARE AT LEAST EQUIVALENT TO THAT
- 7 OF THE AMERICAN BOARD OF INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE; AND

- 17 (B) A BUSINESS ENTITY MAY NOT IDENTIFY, ADVERTISE, OR REPRESENT

- 19 INDUSTRIAL HYGIENISTS IN TRAINING UNLESS THE INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE

- 23 A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SUBTITLE IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND
