SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Transportation

(a) The Administration may isste special commemorative original or substitute registration plates for any geographical, historieal, natural resource, AGRICULTURAL, or envirenmental commemoration of statewide significance.
(b) The owner of a vehicle, or a lessee of the vehicle under a lease not intended as security, or a director, officer, employee, or partner of a business entity that owns the vehicle considered eligible by the Administration may apply to the Administration for the assignment of a commemorative registration plate under this section if the vehicle is included in one of the following classes:
(1) AClass $A$ (passenger) vehicle;
(2) AClass B (for hire) vehicle;
(3) A Class E (truck) vehicle with a manufacturer's rated capacity of one ton or less;
(4) AClass G (trailer) vehicle; or
(5) AClass M (multipurpose) vehicle.

(c) (1) An original or substitute commemorative plate may only be issued under this section for a fixed period of 2 consecutive years after its initial issuance.
(2) The Administration may only issue1 TWO commemorative plate PLATES under this section at any one time.
(d) (1) In addition to the annual registration fee otherwise required under this title, an owner of a vehicle assigned a commemorative registration plate under this section shall pay the fee set by the Administration when the new registration plates are issued to the vehicle under this section.
(2) (i) The Administration shall set the fee at a level that will enable the Administration to recover its costs under this section.
(ii) The Administration may charge a fee that is sufficient to result in a stuplus after costs are subtracted.
(iii) The Administration shall retain a portion of the fee that is sufficient to allow the Administration to recover any costs of issuing and distributing commemorative plates under this section.
(iv) Any surplus meneys remaining after the Administration has recovered the costs of issting a commemorative plate under this section may not be retained by or transferred to any agency of the State for any purpose.
(v) Notwithstanding subparagraph (iv) of this paragraph, the strplus meneys may be retained for the purpose described in paragraph (3) of this subsection.
(3) The surplus moneys shall be disbursed by the Administration to a nomprofit organization that is:
(i) Closely related to the geographical, historical, natural resource, AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION, or environmental theme which the plate
eommemerates; and
(ii) Designated by the Administration under subsection (e) of this
section.
(4) No portion of the fee may be credited to the Gasoline and Motor

Vehicle Revenue Account for distribution under $\S 8-403$ or $\& 8-404$ of the
Transportation Article.
(e) (1) The Administration shall adopt regulations not inconsistent with the Maryland Vehicle Law to govern the isstance of special registration plates under this section.
(2) Before designating any nonprofit organization to receive any strplus moneys and before distributing any strplus meneys to any nomprofit organization,

(iii) The plan of distribution of the funds.
(f) The additional fee to the annual registration fee required by this section is 10 not required for special registration of a vehicle that is exempt under § 13-903 of this 11 title, or a vehicle with a special registration plate recognizing:
(1) The Maryland National Guard; or
(2) A volunteer fire department, volunteer reseue squad, or volumteer 4 ambulance company in this State.

2 (d) A disabled veteran whose vehicle is eligible for exemption under subsection 3 (a)(8) of this section may, if eligible, receive the special registration number and special
4 registration plates provided under § 13-616, § 13-617, § 13-618, § 13-619, [or] §
5 13-619.1, OR § 13-619.2 of this title without payment of the registration fees specified in
6 this subtitle.
7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
8 General Assembly that the Motor Vehicle Administration shall work with the
9 Maryland Agricultural Education Foundation, Inc. on the development of a special
10 registration plate described under Section 1 of this Act and make the plate available to
11 the public at the earliest date practicable, but not later than July 1, 2001.
12 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October July 1, 2000. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 years and, at the end of 14 June 30, 2006, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall
15 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
