- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor to proclaim the month of March each year
- 4 to be "Women's History Month".
- 5 BY adding to

- 12 WHEREAS, American women of every race, class, and ethnic background have
- 13 made historic contributions to the growth and strength of the State in countless and
- 14 unrecorded ways; and
- 15 WHEREAS, American women have played and continue to play a critical
- 16 economic, social, and cultural role in every sphere of life in the State by constituting
- 17 a significant portion of the labor force working inside and outside of the home; and
- WHEREAS, American women have played and continue to play a significant
- 19 role in protecting and preserving the State's environmental resources; and
- WHEREAS, Despite these contributions, the role of American women in history
- 21 has been consistently overlooked and undervalued in literature and the teaching, and
- 22 study of American history; and
- WHEREAS, In 1981, the United States Congress first designated the week of
- 24 March 7, 1982, as Women's History Week; and
- WHEREAS, In 1987, the United States Congress approved the National
- 26 Women's History Month Resolution to expand the national celebration of women's
- 27 history to the entire month of March; and

- WHEREAS, Since then, the United States Congress has annually approved this
- 2 Resolution with bipartisan support, and the President of the United States has
- 3 annually proclaimed March as Women's History Month; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Advocates, parents, and community organizations in thousands of
- 5 American communities have acknowledged National Women's History Month as a
- 6 focus of celebration; and
- WHEREAS, No month is set aside in the State to observe and honor women's
- 8 historical contributions to the State; now, therefore,
- 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 10 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 11 Article State Government
- 12 SUBTITLE 5. COMMEMORATIVE MONTHS.
- 13 13-501.
- 14 (A) IN RECOGNITION OF THE HISTORICAL CONTRIBUTIONS THAT WOMEN
- 15 HAVE MADE TO THE STATE, THE GOVERNOR SHALL PROCLAIM THE MONTH OF
- 16 MARCH EACH YEAR AS WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH.
- 17 (B) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL URGE EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL
- 18 ORGANIZATIONS TO OBSERVE WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH PROPERLY WITH
- 19 APPROPRIATE PROGRAMS, CEREMONIES, AND ACTIVITIES.
- 20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 21 October 1, 2000.
