- 4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain sexual acts and forms of sexual contact
- 5 between certain employers or supervisors and an employee who is a minor;

- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 1 Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

- 3 (a) Except as provided in subsections (b), (c), and (d) of this section, a person
- 4 may not be prosecuted under §§ 462, 463, 464B, [and] 464C, AND 464H of this
- 5 subheading if the victim is the person's legal spouse at the time of the commission of
- 6 the alleged rape or sexual offense.
- 7 (b) A person may be prosecuted under §§ 462(a), 463(a)(1), and 464B(a)(1)(i)
- 8 and (ii) of this subheading for an offense against the person's legal spouse if the
- 9 person and the person's legal spouse have lived separate and apart without
- 10 cohabitation and without interruption:
- 11 (1) Pursuant to a written separation agreement executed by both the
- 12 person and the person's legal spouse; or
- 13 (2) For at least 3 months immediately before the commission of the
- 14 alleged rape or sexual offense.
- 15 (c) (1) A person may be prosecuted for an offense, described in paragraph (2)
- 16 of this subsection, against the person's legal spouse if the person uses force against
- 17 the will and without the consent of the person's legal spouse.
- 18 (2) This subsection applies to the following offenses under this
- 19 subheading:
- 20 (i) § 462(a);
- 21 (ii) § 463(a)(1); and
- 22 (iii) § 464B(a)(1)(i) and (ii).
- 23 (d) A person may be prosecuted for an offense under §§ 462, 463, 464B, [and]
- 24 464C, AND 464H of this subheading against the person's legal spouse if the parties are
- 25 living separate and apart without cohabitation and without interruption pursuant to
- 26 a decree of limited divorce.

- 28 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "MINOR" MEANS ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO IS UNDER THE
- 29 AGE OF 18.
- 30 (B) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 464D OF THIS ARTICLE, AN EMPLOYER OR
- 31 PERSON WHO REGULARLY EXERCISES SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY OVER AN
- 32 EMPLOYEE MAY NOT ENGAGE IN A SEXUAL ACT, SEXUAL CONTACT, OR VAGINAL
- 33 INTERCOURSE WITH THAT EMPLOYEE IF:
- 34 (1) THE EMPLOYEE IS A MINOR; AND

- 1 (2) THE EMPLOYER OR PERSON WHO REGULARLY EXERCISES
- 2 SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY OVER THE EMPLOYEE IS AT LEAST 4 YEARS OLDER THAN
- 3 THE EMPLOYEE.
- 4 (C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF
- 5 A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000
- 6 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 6 MONTHS OR BOTH.
- 7 (D) A SENTENCE IMPOSED FOR VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION MAY BE
- 8 SEPARATE FROM AND CONSECUTIVE TO OR CONCURRENT WITH A SENTENCE FOR
- 9 ANY OTHER OFFENSE UNDER THIS SUBHEADING.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 11 October 1, 2000.
