A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Victims' Rights - Victim and Witness Protection and Relocation Program -**
3 **Assistance for Victims and Witnesses**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring that money appropriated to the Victim and Witness
5 Protection and Relocation Program be used to assist victims and witnesses in a
6 certain manner; and generally relating to the Victim and Witness Protection and
7 Relocation Program.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
9 Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments
10 Section 835

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments**

16 835.

17 (a) There is a Victim and Witness Protection and Relocation Program.

18 (b) The Program shall be administered by the State's Attorneys' Coordinator
19 under Article 10, § 41B of the Code in accordance with regulations adopted by the
20 State's Attorneys' Coordination Council under Article 10, § 41D of the Code after
21 consultation with the State Board of Victim Services.

22 (c) Money appropriated to the Program shall be used to:

23 (1) Protect victims and witnesses and the families of victims and
24 witnesses;

25 (2) [Relocate] ASSIST victims and witnesses for the purpose of protecting
26 them or facilitating their participation in court proceedings; and

1 (3) Pay any costs of administering the Program.

2 (d) To the extent possible, the Program shall be used to maximize the use of
3 federal matching funds or programs.

4 (e) Expenditures under this section shall be made pursuant to an
5 appropriation approved by the General Assembly in the annual State budget.

6 (f) The Program shall be subject to an audit by the Office of Legislative Audits
7 as provided under § 2-1220 of the State Government Article.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 October 1, 2000.
