2 **Vehicle Laws - Parking Lot Requirements - Handicapped Accessible**
3 **Parking**

4 FOR the purpose of clarifying that a parking lot that has been striped, painted, or
5 repainted is an altered parking lot and is required to meet certain handicapped
6 accessible parking requirements; and generally relating to handicapped
7 accessible parking requirements.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article - Transportation**

16 21-1006.

17 (a) (1) [Each parking lot that is constructed or altered after October 1, 1996
18 shall conform with the requirements of the Maryland Accessibility Code adopted
19 under Article 83B, § 6-102 of the Code.] A PARKING LOT SHALL CONFORM WITH THE
20 REQUIREMENTS OF THE MARYLAND ACCESSIBILITY CODE ADOPTED UNDER ARTICLE
21 83B, § 6-102 OF THE CODE IF, AFTER OCTOBER 1, 1996, THE PARKING LOT IS:

22 (I) CONSTRUCTED; OR

23 (II) ALTERED, INCLUDING PAINTED, REPAINTED, OR STRIPED.

24 (2) IF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION CREATE A CONFLICT WITH
25 EXISTING LOCAL LAWS, THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION SHALL PREVAIL.

26 (b) A person may not park a motor vehicle in a space designated for the use of
27 individuals with disabilities unless the vehicle bears a special registration plate, a

1 removable windshield placard, or a temporary removable windshield placard issued
2 by the Administration under § 13-616, § 13-616.1, or § 13-616.2 of this article or
3 similarly by another state, the District of Columbia, or another country.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
5 October 1, 2000.
