


CHAPTER			
1 AN ACT concerning			
2 Somerset County - Power Dredging - Oysters			
FOR the purpose of authorizing the Department of Natural Resources to grant permits to persons before allowing them to catch oysters with a power dredge in Somerset County certain counties; authorizing the Department to issue a power dredge permit to holders of an oyster harvester license; prohibiting persons permitted to catch oysters with a power dredge from harvesting oysters by any other method on certain days; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to harvesting oysters with a power dredge.			
10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 11 Article - Natural Resources 12 Section 4-1014, 4-1014.1, 4-1014.2, and 4-1014.3 13 Annotated Code of Maryland 14 (1997 Replacement Volume and 1999 Supplement)			
15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 (a) This section applies only to the waters of the State that lie contiguous to 20 Somerset County in the Chesapeake Bay.

1 THIS SECTION MAY NOT HARVEST OYSTERS BY ANY OTHER HARVESTING METHODS

The Department shall establish zones by regulations within the following 4 areas in which a person may catch oysters by power dredge only during the power 5 dredging season from November 1 to March 30 in the waters of the State contiguous 6 to Calvert County from its border with Anne Arundel County south of Holland Point, southward to Drum Point, southward to the border waters of St. Mary's County 7 8 following the dredge line toward Hog Point in St. Mary's County, following the Calvert 9 and St. Mary's county line in a northeasterly direction to the Dorchester County line, 10 following the Calvert and Dorchester county line in a northwesterly line to the 11 junction of Calvert, Dorchester, and Talbot county line, continuing in a northwesterly 12 direction along the Calvert and Talbot county line to the junction of Calvert, Talbot, 13 and Anne Arundel county line and back to the point of beginning. 14 (e) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 4-1008(a) of this subtitle, a 15 person may not catch oysters under a power dredging [license] PERMIT: 16 <u>(i)</u> On Saturday or Sunday; 17 (ii) Before sunrise or after 3 p.m. on any day Monday through 18 Friday; or 19 (iii) In any area closed to hydraulic clam dredging under § 4-1006.1 20 of this subtitle. 21 In addition to the provisions of § 4-1013(e) and (f) of this subtitle, a 22 person who holds a power dredging [license] PERMIT under this section: 23 <u>(i)</u> Has a limit of 12 bushels for each person or 24 bushels per boat, 24 with a limit of two [licensed] PERMITTED power dredgers per boat; and 25 May use only a power dredge bar of at least 36 inches and not (ii) 26 exceeding 42 inches. 27 The Secretary shall adopt regulations to implement this section. 	(d) The Department shall establish zones by regulations within the following areas in which a person may catch oysters by power dredging only during the power dredging season. The power dredging season for oysters shall run from November 1 to

1 March 30 in the waters of the State that lie contiguous to Dorchester County, 2 beginning at the southernmost point of land at Pry Island, then running coterminous 3 with the crab pot line to the southernmost point of land at James Island, then to the 4 lighted buoy at Kenwood Beach, at latitude 38 degrees 30 minutes, then to the point 5 of beginning. - 6 the end of May 31, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, 7 this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
