1 AN ACT concerning

Homicide by Aggressive Driving

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the crime of homicide by aggressive driving for a

- 4 person who commits at least a certain number of motor vehicle violations in
- 5 connection with a single traffic incident that results in the death of another
- 6 person; providing for certain penalties; specifying certain violations to which the
- 7 crime of homicide by aggressive driving applies; providing for the assessment of
- 8 points by the Motor Vehicle Administration for a conviction for the crime of
- 9 homicide by aggressive driving; defining a certain term; and generally relating
- 10 to establishing the crime of homicide by aggressive driving.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

(A) IN THIS SECTION, "SINGLE TRAFFIC INCIDENT" MEANS AN ACCIDENT
26 THAT OCCURS WITHIN THE SAME COURSE OF CONDUCT AND DURING THE
27 CONTINUOUS OPERATION OF A MOTOR VEHICLE WITHOUT INTERRUPTION.

(B) A PERSON IS GUILTY OF HOMICIDE BY AGGRESSIVE DRIVING IF, WHILE
 DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE, THAT PERSON COMMITS TWO OR MORE OF THE
 VIOLATIONS THAT ARE SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION THAT GIVE
 RISE TO A SINGLE TRAFFIC INCIDENT THAT RESULTS IN THE DEATH OF ANOTHER
 PERSON.
