3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the display, exhibition, or provision of certain adult

- 4 materials to minors; prohibiting the admission of certain minors to motion
- 5 picture shows or other presentations containing certain adult material;
- 6 prohibiting the display for advertising purposes of certain material to a certain
- 7 class of persons; providing a certain defense; defining and altering the
- 8 definitions of certain terms; and generally relating to nudity and sexual displays

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 4	The following words and phrases, as used in this subheading, have the meanings indicated:
5	(a) "ADULT MATERIAL" MEANS MATERIAL THAT:
8	(1) AN AVERAGE ADULT APPLYING CONTEMPORARY COMMUNITY STANDARDS WOULD FIND THAT THE WORK, TAKEN AS A WHOLE AND WITH RESPECT TO MINORS, INTENTIONALLY APPEALS OR PANDERS TO A PRURIENT INTEREST IN NUDITY, SEX, OR EXCRETION;

(2) AN AVERAGE ADULT APPLYING CONTEMPORARY COMMUNITY
 STANDARDS WOULD FIND THAT THE DEPICTION OR DESCRIPTION OF
 SADOMASOCHISTIC ABUSE, SEXUAL EXCITEMENT, OR SEXUAL CONDUCT IN THE
 MATERIAL OR PERFORMANCE IS PATENTLY OFFENSIVE TO PREVAILING STANDARDS
 IN THE ADULT COMMUNITY CONCERNING WHAT IS SUITABLE FOR MINORS; AND

15 (3) A REASONABLE PERSON WOULD FIND THAT THE WORK, TAKEN AS A
16 WHOLE, LACKS SERIOUS EDUCATIONAL, LITERARY, ARTISTIC, POLITICAL, OR
17 SCIENTIFIC VALUE FOR MINORS.

18 (B) "Advertising purposes" means the purpose of propagandizing in connection 19 with the sale commercially of a product or products, or the offering commercially of a 20 service, or the exhibiting commercially of entertainment.

21 (C) "KNOWINGLY" MEANS HAVING KNOWLEDGE OR REASON TO KNOW OF THE 22 CHARACTER AND CONTENT OF THE ADULT MATERIAL.

23 [(b)] (D) "Minor" means any person under eighteen years of age.

[(c)] (E) "Sadomasochistic abuse" means flagellation or torture by or upon a
human who is nude, or clad in undergarments, or in a revealing or bizarre costume, or
the condition of one who is nude or so clothed and is being fettered, bound, or
otherwise physically restrained FOR THE PURPOSE OF SEXUAL STIMULATION OR
SEXUAL ABUSE.

[(d)] (F) "Sexual conduct" means human masturbation, sexual intercourse,
LEWD EXHIBITION OF THE GENITALS, or any touching of or contact with, FOR THE
PURPOSE OF SEXUAL STIMULATION OR SEXUAL ABUSE, genitals, pubic areas or
buttocks of the human male or female, or the breasts of the female, whether alone or
between members of the same or opposite sex, or between humans and animals.

[(e)] (G) "Sexual excitement" means the condition of human male or female
genitals, or the breasts of the female, when in a state of sexual stimulation, or the
sensual experiences of humans engaging in or witnessing sexual conduct or nudity
FOR THE PURPOSE OF SEXUAL STIMULATION OR SEXUAL ABUSE.

Any person, firm or corporation which knowingly sells, DISPLAYS, EXHIBITS, OR
PROVIDES, or offers to sell, DISPLAY, EXHIBIT, OR PROVIDE, to any minor any ADULT
MATERIAL CONTAINING EITHER of the following is guilty of a misdemeanor:

5 (a) Any picture, photograph, drawing, sculpture, motion picture, film or other 6 visual representation or image of a person or portion of the human body that depicts 7 sadomasochistic abuse, sexual conduct or sexual excitement; or

8 (b) Any book, magazine, paperback, pamphlet or other written or printed 9 matter however reproduced, or any sound recording which contains any matter 10 enumerated in subsection (a), or obscenities, or explicit verbal descriptions or 11 narrative accounts of sexual conduct, sexual excitement or sadomasochistic abuse.

12 416C.

Any person, firm or corporation which, for a monetary consideration or other valuable commodity or service, knowingly exhibits to a minor who is unaccompanied by his parent or guardian, or knowingly sells to a minor an admission ticket or other means to gain entrance to, or knowingly admits a minor who is unaccompanied by his parent or guardian to premises where there is exhibited a motion picture show or sother presentation, whether animated or live, which IS ADULT MATERIAL AND in whole or in part depicts or reveals sexual conduct, sexual excitement or sadomasochistic abuse, or which includes obscenities or explicit verbal descriptions or

21 narrative accounts of sexual conduct, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

22 416D.

(a) Any person, firm or corporation is guilty of a misdemeanor if it knowingly
displays for advertising purposes any ADULT MATERIAL, TO MINORS OR THE
GENERAL PUBLIC, CONTAINING A picture, photograph, drawing, sculpture or other
visual representation or image of a person or portion of the human body that depicts
sadomasochistic abuse, sexual conduct or sexual excitement, or any verbal description
or narrative account of these activities or items.

(b) Any person, firm or corporation is guilty of a misdemeanor, if it knowinglygo permits any such display on premises owned, rented or managed by it.
