BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 19 **Article - Transportation** 20 21-1122. 21 In this section, "sound amplification system" means a compact disc player, (a) 22 a radio, a tape player, or a similar device. This section does not apply to: 23 (b) 24 (1)Authorized emergency vehicles;

25 (2) Vehicles operated by communications, electric, gas, or water utilities;

1 (3) A sound amplification system operated to request assistance or to 2 warn of a hazardous situation; or

3 (4) Unless otherwise prohibited by local law, a sound amplification 4 system used for advertising, parades, or for political or other special events.

5 (c) When a motor vehicle is being operated on a highway, the driver of the 6 vehicle may not operate or permit the operation of a sound amplification system from 7 the vehicle that can be heard outside the vehicle from 50 or more feet.

8 [(d) A person who violates subsection (c) of this section is subject to a civil 9 penalty not exceeding \$50.]

11 (a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the 12 Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation:

13 (1) Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any 14 other law of this State; or

15 (2) Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of the 16 Maryland Vehicle Law.

17 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a
18 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is
19 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 October 1, 2000.
