- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 4	(a) In this section, "sound amplification system" means a compact disc player, a radio, a tape player, or a similar device.
5	(b) This section does not apply to:
6	(1) Authorized emergency vehicles;
7	(2) Vehicles operated by communications, electric, gas, or water utilities;
8 9	(3) A sound amplification system operated to request assistance or to warn of a hazardous situation; or
10 11	(4) Unless otherwise prohibited by local law, a sound amplification system used for advertising, parades, or for political or other special events.
	(c) When a motor vehicle is being operated on a highway, the driver of the vehicle may not operate or permit the operation of a sound amplification system from the vehicle that can be heard outside the vehicle from 50 or more feet.
15 16	[(d) A person who violates subsection (c) of this section is subject to a civil penalty not exceeding \$50.]
17 18	(D) (1) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO CRIMINAL PENALTIES UNDER § 27-101 OF THIS ARTICLE.
19 20	(2) <u>A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION IS NOT CONSIDERED A MOVING</u> VIOLATION FOR PURPOSES OF § 16-402 OF THIS ARTICLE.

22 23	(a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation:
24 25	(1) Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any other law of this State; or
26 27	(2) Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of the Maryland Vehicle Law.
	(b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is subject to a fine of not more than \$500.
