 FOR the purpose of adding Caroline County to the list of counties in which a person
- 4 may not possess in an open container any alcoholic beverage while in shopping

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article 2B Alcoholic Beverages
- 15 19-301.
- 16 (a) (1) This definition applies only in the following jurisdictions:
- 17 (i) CAROLINE COUNTY;
- 18 (II) Carroll County;
- 19 [(ii)] (III) Dorchester County;
- 20 [(iii)] (IV) Harford County; and
- 21 [(iv)] (V) Montgomery County.
- 22 (2) In this section "unless authorized" means the possession and
- 23 presentation of a written consent by the owner of the property.

- 1 (b) A person may not possess in an open container any alcoholic beverage, as 2 defined in this article, while:
- 3 (1) On the mall, adjacent parking area, or other outside area of any 4 combination of privately owned retail establishments, commonly known as a shopping
- 5 center, to which the general public is invited for business purposes, unless authorized
- 6 by the owner of the establishment;
- 7 (2) On an adjacent parking area or other outside area of any other retail 8 establishment, unless authorized by the owner of the establishment; or
- 9 (3) In any parked vehicle located on any of the places enumerated in this 10 section, unless authorized.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 October 1, 2000.
