12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

3 (2) In this section "unless authorized" means the possession and 4 presentation of a written consent by the owner of the property.

5 (b) A person may not possess in an open container any alcoholic beverage, as 6 defined in this article, while:

7 (1) On the mall, adjacent parking area, or other outside area of any 8 combination of privately owned retail establishments, commonly known as a shopping 9 center, to which the general public is invited for business purposes, unless authorized 10 by the owner of the establishment;

11 (2) On an adjacent parking area or other outside area of any other retail 12 establishment, unless authorized by the owner of the establishment; or

13 (3) In any parked vehicle located on any of the places enumerated in this 14 section, unless authorized.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 16 October 1, 2000.
