- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 21 Article Natural Resources
- 22 10-607.
- 23 (d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, only persons
- 24 owning at least 250 yards of continuous shoreline may erect an offshore stationary
- 25 blind or blind site.
- 26 (2) A riparian landowner who owns less than 250 yards of continuous
- 27 shoreline may erect an offshore stationary blind or blind site if the riparian

- 1 landowner has the written consent of adjoining riparian landowners to achieve the
- 2 required 250 yards of continuous shoreline.
- 3 10-608.
- 4 (g) In Kent County [and], Queen Anne's County, AND CAROLINE COUNTY and
- 5 on the nontidal waters of the Potomac River and its nontidal tributaries, only a
- 6 riparian landowner owning the amount of shoreline required under § 10-607(d) of
- 7 this subtitle or a landowner's lessee, licensee, or assignee may erect and maintain a
- 8 stationary blind or blind site.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 10 October 1, 2000.
