BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 20 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 21 13-101. 22 A holder of any class of retail alcoholic beverages license or an (1) 23 employee designated by the holder shall complete training in an approved alcohol 24 awareness program. The training shall be valid for a period of 4 years, and the holder 25 shall complete retraining in an approved program for each successive 4-year period. 26 (2)This paragraph applies only in the following jurisdictions: (i)
