- 3 FOR the purpose of allowing a person hunting deer to use leashed trailing dogs in
- 4 certain circumstances; preventing certain police officers from killing leashed
- 5 trailing dogs in certain counties; defining certain terms; and generally relating
- 6 to the use of dogs when hunting deer.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 Article Natural Resources
- 20 10-416.
- 21 (a) (1) A person may not hunt deer in the State with any automatic firearm.
- 22 In this subsection, an automatic firearm means a firearm designed to fire, or which is
- 23 mechanically altered to fire, 2 or more shots with 1 continuous pressure on the
- 24 trigger.
- 25 (2) A person may not use full metal-jacketed, incendiary, or tracer
- 26 bullets in hunting deer in the State. However, the use of metal-jacketed bullets
- 27 designed to expand on impact is not prohibited.

SENATE BILL 481

- 1 A person may not hunt deer with any firearm that uses an (3) 2 ammunition clip holding more than 8 cartridges or bullets. In this paragraph, "ammunition clip" includes a cartridge or bullet holder called a banana clip. 4 FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION, "LEASHED TRAILING DOG" 5 MEANS A DOG THAT HAS BEEN TRAINED TO FIND DEER THAT HAVE BEEN WOUNDED 6 BY THE HUNTER. 7 [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3), OF THIS (I) (2) 8 SUBSECTION, A person may not take a dog into the woods or possess or control a dog 9 in the woods and use the dog to hunt deer. [In] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN ITEM (IV) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, 10 (II)11 IN all counties, except Baltimore, Harford, Howard, Montgomery, Prince George's, 12 Somerset, and Worcester Counties, any Natural Resources police officer, law 13 enforcement officer, or any other person may kill [any] A dog found pursuing [any] 14 A deer. 15 In Caroline, Dorchester, Talbot, Kent, Anne Arundel, Cecil, (III) 16 Charles, Garrett, St. Mary's, Queen Anne's, Frederick, Carroll, and Calvert Counties, 17 dogs that are engaged in fox hunting and who have broken away may not be killed 18 under this subsection. 19 IN ALL COUNTIES, A NATURAL RESOURCES POLICE OFFICER, (IV) 20 LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, OR ANY OTHER PERSON MAY NOT KILL A LEASHED 21 TRAILING DOG PURSUING A DEER WOUNDED BY THE HUNTER.
- 22 (3) A HUNTER MAY TAKE A LEASHED TRAILING DOG INTO THE WOODS
- 23 OR POSSESS OR CONTROL A LEASHED TRAILING DOG IN THE WOODS AND USE THE
- 24 LEASHED TRAILING DOG TO RECOVER A DEER WOUNDED BY THE HUNTER.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 26 October 1, 2000.
