FOR the purpose of establishing that a certain alcoholic beverages licensee or a certain alcoholic beverages applicant may appeal a decision of a local alcoholic beverages licensing board to the circuit court of the county under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the appeal of a final decision of a local alcoholic beverages licensing board.
