A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Correctional Officers' Retirement System - Transfer of Service Credit from**
3 **Employees' Pension System**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain members of the Correctional Officers'
5 Retirement System to receive eligibility service credit for certain service
6 transferred from the Employees' Pension System.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions**

20 25-201.

21 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this subtitle applies
22 only to:

- 23 (1) correctional officers serving in any of the first six job classifications;
24 and
25 (2) security attendants at Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center.

1 (b) This subtitle does not apply to an employee of the Baltimore City Jail as of
2 June 30, 1991, who:

3 (1) became an employee of the Baltimore City Detention Center on July
4 1, 1991; and

5 (2) who did not elect to become a member of the Correctional Officers'
6 Retirement System on that date.

7 25-303.

8 Eligibility service for a member consists of service credit:

9 (1) for employment as a member;

10 (2) regained under § 25-304 of this subtitle by a member who redeposits
11 accumulated contributions previously withdrawn;

12 (3) transferred from a retirement or pension system under Title 37 of
13 this article or Title 31, Subtitle 1 of this article;

14 (4) for military service as provided in Title 38 of this article; [or]

15 (5) purchased under this subtitle; OR

16 (6) TRANSFERRED FROM THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM FOR AN
17 INDIVIDUAL WHO WAS VESTED BUT WHOSE MEMBERSHIP IN THE EMPLOYEES'
18 PENSION SYSTEM TERMINATED AS A RESULT OF BEING LAID OFF FOR
19 NONDISCIPLINARY REASONS.

20 25-401.

21 (a) A member may retire with a normal service retirement allowance if:

22 (1) on or before the date of retirement, the member has at least 20 years
23 of eligibility service;

24 (2) for at least 5 years immediately before retirement, the member was a
25 security attendant at Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center, a correctional officer in any
26 of the first six job classifications, or in a combination of these positions; and

27 (3) the member completes and submits a written application to the
28 Board of Trustees stating the date when the member desires to retire.

29 (b) On retirement under this section, a member is entitled to receive a normal
30 service retirement allowance that equals one fifty-fifth of the member's average final
31 compensation multiplied by the number of years of creditable service.

32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
33 July 1, 2000.
