- 15 (a) A member may retire with a normal service retirement allowance if:
- 16 (1) on or before the date of retirement, the member has at least 20 years 17 of eligibility service;
- 18 (2) for at least 5 years immediately before retirement, the member was a
- 19 security attendant at Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center, a correctional officer in any
- 20 of the first six job classifications, or in a combination of these positions; and
- 21 (3) the member completes and submits a written application to the
- 22 Board of Trustees stating the date when the member desires to retire.
- 23 (b) On retirement under this section, a member is entitled to receive a normal
- 24 service retirement allowance that equals one fifty-fifth of the member's average final
- 25 compensation multiplied by the number of years of creditable service.
- 26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 27 July 1, 2000.
