NOTHING IN THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO REOUIRE 30 31 ANY INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION TO PROVIDE OR PAY FOR VACCINATIONS

- 33 THE SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE MARYLAND HIGHER
- 34 EDUCATION COMMISSION, SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT

- 1 (C) The Secretary may enter on and inspect private property to determine the 2 presence, cause, and source of an infectious or contagious disease.
- 3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 June 1, 2000.
