BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 18 **Article - Education** 19 18-703.1.

- **SENATE BILL 686** "AREA OF CRITICAL SHORTAGE" MEANS AN ACADEMIC FIELD (2)2 IDENTIFIED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 3 PROVISIONS OF § 18-703(G) OF THIS SUBTITLE AS HAVING PROJECTED EMPLOYMENT 4 VACANCIES WHICH SUBSTANTIALLY EXCEED PROJECTED QUALIFIED GRADUATES. "AREA OF GEOGRAPHIC SHORTAGE" MEANS A GEOGRAPHIC AREA OF 5 6 THE STATE IDENTIFIED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION AS LESS ABLE THAN 7 OTHERS IN THE STATE TO SATISFY THE NEED FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS IN AN 8 ACADEMIC FIELD IDENTIFIED FOR AT LEAST 3 YEARS AS AN AREA OF CRITICAL 9 SHORTAGE. "ELIGIBLE INSTITUTION" MEANS AN ACCREDITED COLLEGE OR 10 (4) 11 UNIVERSITY THAT HAS A PROGRAM OF GRADUATE STUDIES THAT WOULD CERTIFY 12 THE RECIPIENT TO TEACH IN THIS STATE IN AN AREA OF CRITICAL SHORTAGE AND 13 THAT IS: 14 (I) AUTHORIZED BY THE MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION 15 COMMISSION; AND 16 APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION. (II)"PUBLIC SCHOOL" MEANS A SCHOOL IN THE PUBLIC ELEMENTARY 17 18 AND SECONDARY EDUCATION SYSTEM IN THIS STATE. "SERVICE OBLIGATION" MEANS TO TEACH FOR 3 YEARS IN THE 19 (6) 20 STATE IN AN AREA OF GEOGRAPHIC OR CRITICAL SHORTAGE IN A PUBLIC SCHOOL. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STUDENT ASSISTANCE GRANTS MAY BE 21 (B) (1) 22 AWARDED AS SECOND CAREER TEACHER EDUCATION ASSISTANCE GRANTS. 23 THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL AWARD ANNUALLY TO ELIGIBLE 24 APPLICANTS ASSISTANCE GRANTS TO INDIVIDUALS WITH DEGREES TO CHANGE 25 CAREERS AND ENROLL IN A PROGRAM OF STUDY LEADING TO CERTIFICATION TO 26 TEACH IN AREAS OF CRITICAL OR GEOGRAPHIC SHORTAGE. 27 THE RECIPIENT OF A SECOND CAREER TEACHER EDUCATION 28 ASSISTANCE GRANT SHALL USE THE AWARD AT AN ELIGIBLE INSTITUTION. A RECIPIENT OF AN ASSISTANCE GRANT SHALL: 29 (C) HAVE AN UNDERGRADUATE OR GRADUATE DEGREE AND BE 30 (1)
- 31 ENROLLED IN OR SIGN A LETTER OF INTENT TO ENROLL IN COURSES LEADING TO
- 32 CERTIFICATION TO TEACH IN AN AREA OF CRITICAL OR GEOGRAPHIC SHORTAGE;
- 33 (2) AGREE TO ENROLL FULL TIME IN AN ELIGIBLE INSTITUTION;
- 34 COMPLETE THE REQUIRED STUDIES IN 1 YEAR; (3)
- PERFORM THE SERVICE OBLIGATION UPON COMPLETION OF (4) 36 REQUIRED STUDIES; AND

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2000. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 <u>4</u> years and, at the end of September 30, 2003 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
