- 1 (I) (H) ON JULY 1, 2001 AND ANNUALLY ON JULY 1 THEREAFTER, JULY 1, 2 2002, AND JUNE 30, 2003, THE TASK FORCE ADVISORY COUNCIL SHALL SUBMIT A 3 REPORT OF ITS FINDINGS, ACTIVITIES, AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR 4 AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL 5 ASSEMBLY.

 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Office of Children,
- 7 Youth, and Families shall execute a memorandum of understanding between the
- 8 Office, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, and the Maryland State
- 9 Department of Education shall execute a memorandum of understanding about *That*
- 10 the Office of Children, Youth, and Families shall execute a memorandum of
- 11 understanding between the Office, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, and
- 12 the Maryland State Department of Education providing that either the Department of
- 13 Health and Mental Hygiene or the Maryland State Department of Education shall
- 14 provide staffing for the Advisory Council and any related issues that require
- 15 coordination.
- 16 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the initial appointed
- 17 members of the Task Force shall be appointed on or before July 1, 2000. The terms of
- 18 the members appointed by the Governor serving on July 1, 2000 shall end as follows:
- 19 (1) four in 2001;
- 20 (2) four in 2002;
- 21 (3) four in 2003; and
- 22 (4) five in 2004.
- 23 SECTION 4. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 24 effect July 1, 2000. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of
- 25 June 30, 2003, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall
- 26 <u>be abrogated and no further force and effect.</u>
