- 16 (K) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE GENERAL 17 ASSEMBLY:

- 23 (L) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO ADMINISTER THE
- 24 GRANT PROGRAM AND TO REQUIRE THAT ALL EXISTING EARLY ELEMENTARY
- 25 EDUCATION PROGRAMS BE NAMED JUDITH P. HOYER EARLY EDUCATION PROGRAMS.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Governor shall
- 27 include \$8 million in the fiscal year 2001 budget of the Department of Education to
- 28 fund the grant program established by this Act.
- 29 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 30 July 1, 2000.
