- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring nursing homes to meet certain staffing requirements to
- 4 qualify for licensure; requiring nursing homes to employ certain individuals for
- 5 certain positions; specifying certain duties that certain individuals may not
- 6 perform; specifying certain staffing levels for nursing homes; requiring nursing
- 7 homes to post certain information in certain areas of the home on a certain form
- 8 developed by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; providing for
- 9 certification of staffing levels; authorizing the Department to improve working
- 10 conditions and salary levels; providing for certain penalties; authorizing the
- Department to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to staffing
- 12 requirements for nursing homes.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 20 Article Health General
- 21 19-1410.
- 22 (A) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 23 INDICATED.
- 24 (1) "LICENSED PERSONNEL" MEANS:
- 25 (I) A REGISTERED NURSE WHO IS LICENSED TO PRACTICE IN THE
- 26 STATE; OR

- 1 (II)A PRACTICAL NURSE WHO IS LICENSED TO PRACTICE IN THE 2 STATE. "UNLICENSED PERSONNEL" MEANS A CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT, 4 NURSE AIDE, CERTIFIED MEDICATION AIDE, OR OTHER NURSING HOME EMPLOYEE 5 REQUIRED TO PROVIDE DIRECT NURSING CARE TO NURSING HOME RESIDENTS. A NURSING HOME SHALL EMPLOY STAFF SUFFICIENT IN NUMBER AND 6 7 QUALIFICATIONS TO MEET THE SCHEDULED AND UNSCHEDULED NURSING CARE 8 NEEDS OF THE RESIDENTS. 9 (C) TO QUALIFY FOR A LICENSE OR RENEWAL LICENSE: 10 (1) A NURSING HOME SHALL PROVIDE SUFFICIENT STAFF TO ENSURE 11 AT LEAST A TOTAL OF 4 HOURS OF DIRECT NURSING CARE PER RESIDENT PER DAY; 12 (2) OF THE TOTAL DIRECT NURSING CARE HOURS PER PATIENT PER 13 DAY, AT LEAST 3 HOURS OF THAT CARE SHALL BE PROVIDED BY UNLICENSED 14 PERSONNEL AND AT LEAST 1 HOUR OF THAT CARE SHALL BE PROVIDED BY 15 LICENSED PERSONNEL; LICENSED PERSONNEL AND UNLICENSED PERSONNEL MAY NOT 16 (3) 17 PROVIDE FOOD PREPARATION, HOUSEKEEPING, LAUNDRY, OR MAINTENANCE 18 SERVICES; AND 19 AN INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYED TO PROVIDE FOOD PREPARATION, 20 HOUSEKEEPING, LAUNDRY, OR MAINTENANCE SERVICES MAY NOT PROVIDE 21 NURSING CARE TO RESIDENTS. 22 (D) A NURSING HOME SHALL DISPLAY ON EACH FLOOR OF THE HOME A 23 NOTICE THAT EXPLAINS THE CURRENT RATIO OF LICENSED PERSONNEL TO 24 RESIDENTS AND UNLICENSED PERSONNEL TO RESIDENTS. 25 THE NOTICE SHALL BE: (2) POSTED IN A LOCATION THAT IS VISIBLE AND ACCESSIBLE TO 26 (I) 27 RESIDENTS, FAMILY MEMBERS OF THE RESIDENTS, CAREGIVERS, AND POTENTIAL 28 CONSUMERS; AND 29 ON A FORM PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT. (II)
- 30 THE STAFFING REQUIREMENTS UNDER THIS SECTION ARE (E) (1)
- 31 MINIMUM REOUIREMENTS AND MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT THE ABILITY OF
- 32 THE NURSING HOME TO EMPLOY ADDITIONAL STAFF.
- FOR A NURSING HOME OR GROUP OF NURSING HOMES, THE 33
- 34 DEPARTMENT MAY INCREASE THE MINIMUM STAFF RATIO TO ADDRESS RESIDENT
- 35 ACUITY LEVELS.

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- 1 (3) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS FOR THE
- 2 IMPLEMENTATION OF STAFFING REQUIREMENTS ABOVE THE MINIMUM LEVELS
- 3 REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION.
- 4 (F) FOR ANY NURSING HOME WITH A CURRENT MARYLAND LICENSE ON
- 5 OCTOBER 1, 2000, THE NURSING HOME MUST PROVIDE CERTIFICATION TO THE
- 6 DEPARTMENT THAT THE MINIMUM STAFFING REQUIREMENTS WILL BE MET AS OF
- 7 APRIL 1, 2002.
- 8 (G) FOR ANY NURSING HOME APPLYING FOR A NEW MARYLAND LICENSE ON
- 9 OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2000, THE NURSING HOME SHALL PROVIDE CERTIFICATION TO
- 10 THE DEPARTMENT THAT THE MINIMUM STAFFING REQUIREMENTS WILL BE MET NO
- 11 LATER THAN JANUARY 1, 2001.

- 13 (A) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 14 INDICATED.
- 15 (1) "LICENSED PERSONNEL" MEANS:
- 16 (I) A REGISTERED NURSE WHO IS LICENSED TO PRACTICE IN THE
- 17 STATE; OR
- 18 (II) A PRACTICAL NURSE WHO IS LICENSED TO PRACTICE IN THE
- 19 STATE.
- 20 "UNLICENSED PERSONNEL" MEANS A CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT,
- 21 NURSE AIDE, CERTIFIED MEDICATION AIDE, OR OTHER NURSING HOME EMPLOYEE
- 22 REQUIRED TO PROVIDE DIRECT NURSING CARE TO NURSING HOME RESIDENTS.
- 23 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL TAKE AFFIRMATIVE ACTION TO IMPROVE
- 24 WORKING CONDITIONS AND INCREASE RETENTION OF NURSING HOME DIRECT CARE
- 25 PERSONNEL. THIS ACTION SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, MODIFICATION
- 26 OF THE DEPARTMENT'S MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT METHODOLOGY TO PROVIDE
- 27 ADDITIONAL MEDICAID FUNDS FOR:
- 28 (1) REIMBURSEMENT OF NURSING HOME STAFFING COSTS THAT ARE
- 29 INCURRED UNDER § 19-1410 OF THIS SUBTITLE;
- 30 (2) THE REIMBURSEMENT OF TRAINING EXPENSES FOR LICENSED
- 31 PERSONNEL AND UNLICENSED PERSONNEL; AND
- 32 (3) DIRECT REIMBURSEMENT TO NURSING HOMES TO INCREASE THE
- 33 HOURLY WAGE OF CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANTS TO A MINIMUM OF \$2 PER HOUR.
- 34 (C) THE SECRETARY MAY ADOPT THE REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY
- 35 OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

- 2 IF A NURSING HOME FAILS TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 19-1410 OF THIS
- 3 SUBTITLE, THE SECRETARY MAY IMPOSE ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING
- 4 PENALTIES:
- 5 (1) REQUIRE A NURSING HOME TO PROVIDE AN ACCEPTABLE PLAN OF
- 6 CORRECTION OR SHOW CAUSE TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE DEPARTMENT WHY IT
- 7 IS IMPOSSIBLE FOR THE NURSING HOME TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS;
- 8 (2) SUSPENSION OF THE NURSING HOME LICENSE;
- 9 (3) REVOCATION OF THE NURSING HOME LICENSE;
- 10 (4) \$500 PER DAY FOR EACH DAY A VIOLATION CONTINUES; OR
- 11 (5) DECERTIFICATION.
- 12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 13 October 1, 2000.
