6 7	(A) THERE IS A GOVERNOR'S WELLMOBILE PROGRAM WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND SCHOOL OF NURSING.
8	(B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO:
	(1) DELIVER PRIMARY AND PREVENTIVE HEALTH CARE SERVICES TO GEOGRAPHICALLY UNDERSERVED COMMUNITIES AND UNINSURED INDIVIDUALS AROUND THE STATE; AND
	(2) PROVIDE PRINCIPAL TRAINING SITES FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND SCHOOL OF NURSING THAT WILL EXPAND STUDENT LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES IN THE CARE OF UNDERSERVED POPULATIONS.

	(2) THE PURPOSE OF THE ADVISORY BOARD IS TO ASSIST THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND SCHOOL OF NURSING IN OVERSEEING AND RAISING FUNDS FOR THE PROGRAM.

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1 (B) THE ADVISORY BOARD CONSISTS OF NINE INDIVIDUALS, OF WHOM:

2 (1) ONE SHALL BE THE DEAN OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND 3 SCHOOL OF NURSING;

4 (2) ONE SHALL BE A MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES 5 APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER;

6 (3) ONE SHALL BE A MEMBER OF THE SENATE APPOINTED BY THE 7 PRESIDENT;

8 (4) TWO SHALL HAVE BUSINESS EXPERTISE;

9 (5) TWO SHALL HAVE HEALTH EXPERTISE; AND

10 (6) TWO SHALL HAVE MEDIA OR MARKETING EXPERTISE.

(C) EXCEPT FOR THE EX OFFICIO AND LEGISLATIVE MEMBERS, THE
 MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY BOARD SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR WITH
 THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE.

14 (D) THE DEAN OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND SCHOOL OF NURSING15 SHALL SERVE AS THE CHAIRMAN OF THE ADVISORY BOARD.

16 (E) (1) EXCEPT FOR THE EX OFFICIO AND LEGISLATIVE MEMBERS, THE 17 TERM OF A MEMBER IS 3 YEARS.

18 (2) EXCEPT FOR THE EX OFFICIO AND LEGISLATIVE MEMBERS, THE 19 TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR 20 MEMBERS OF THE BOARD ON OCTOBER 1, 2000.

21 (3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A 22 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

23(4)A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES24ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

25 (F) THE BOARD SHALL MEET AT LEAST FOUR TIMES EACH YEAR, AT THE 26 TIMES AND PLACES THAT IT DETERMINES.

28 (A) THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND SCHOOL OF NURSING AND THE ADVISORY
29 BOARD SHALL ENSURE THAT THE FOLLOWING GEOGRAPHIC AREAS ARE SERVED BY

12 (3) DEVELOP A MECHANISM FOR RECEIVING THIRD PARTY 13 REIMBURSEMENT.

14 (C) THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, BALTIMORE MAY ESTABLISH A
15 NONPROFIT CORPORATION TO ACCEPT ANY PUBLIC AND PRIVATE GRANTS OR
16 DONATIONS MADE TO THE PROGRAM.

17 (D) (1) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE UNIVERSITY OF
18 MARYLAND SCHOOL OF NURSING AND THE ADVISORY BOARD SHALL SUBMIT A
19 REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE

25 (III) THE ESTABLISHMENT AND CONTINUATION OF ANY PUBLIC OR 26 PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS;

27(IV)THE FUNDING RECEIVED FROM PUBLIC AND PRIVATE28 SOURCES;

29 (V) FUNDS RECEIVED THROUGH THIRD PARTY REIMBURSEMENT;

30(VI)THE CONDITION AND MAINTENANCE EXPENSES OF VEHICLES31USED BY THE PROGRAM TO DELIVER HEALTH CARE SERVICES;

32 (VII) THE AREAS SERVED BY THE PROGRAM;

33 (VIII) THE IMPACT OF THE PROGRAM IN THE COMMUNITIES SERVED;

34 AND

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1 (IX) ANY RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ENHANCING OR FURTHERING 2 THE PURPOSES OF THE PROGRAM.

3 (2) THE OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE AUDITS SHALL AUDIT THE ACCOUNTS
4 AND TRANSACTIONS OF THE GOVERNOR'S WELLMOBILE PROGRAM ANNUALLY IN
5 ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 2-1220 THROUGH 2-1227 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT
6 ARTICLE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial
members of the Governor's Wellmobile Program advisory board shall expire as
follows:

10 (1) Two members in 2001;

11 (2) Two members in 2002; and

12 (3) Two members in 2003.

13 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 14 October 1, 2000.

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
