22	WHEREAS, Millions of Africans were forcibly brought into Maryland from the 17th through the 19th centuries and subjected to unparalleled suffering and death, in order to provide the means for economic and social development for the lives of others in the State; and
24 25	WHEREAS, The impact of this unparalleled suffering on those people and on their African American descendants, as well as on the social development of

5	WHEREAS, An entity is needed to work with grass roots organizations, foundations, and government agencies in publicizing and seeking support for initiatives relating to the history and legacy of slavery, with special attention to the development of initiatives aimed at and benefitting Maryland youth; and
9	WHEREAS, The State needs to target funding for the identification and maintenance of library and archival resources relevant to the history and legacy of slavery, in order to produce guides and maintain on-line databases of relevant holdings, especially holdings not appropriately cataloged and documented; and
13 14	WHEREAS, There needs to be an aggressive, racially inclusive campaign in Maryland to identify historical sites throughout the State that relate to the history and legacy of slavery - including historically African American communities that developed as a result of slavery, Reconstruction, and Jim Crow practices - and to monitor the preservation and development of those sites; and
	WHEREAS, There needs to be an entity in Maryland that will keep the State informed of how best to support programs and initiatives to commemorate the middle passage, slavery, indentured servitude, and the underground railroad; and
21	WHEREAS, There needs to be an entity in Maryland that can keep the State informed of the latest research on the lingering psychological, sociological, and economic impacts of slavery and its legacy, including the impact on crime and crime control; and
25 26	WHEREAS, There needs to be an entity in Maryland to work cooperatively with private and public tourist agencies and organizations to oversee and monitor the allocation of public resources to sites and undertakings relating to the history and legacy of slavery in Maryland, and ensure that there is a fair allocation of resources for African American businesses and institutions; now, therefore,

1 (5) THE FOLLOWING INDIVIDUALS, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR: 2 TWO HISTORIANS WHO ARE KNOWLEDGEABLE ABOUT (I) 3 MARYLAND HISTORY, AND PARTICULARLY ABOUT THE MIDDLE PASSAGE, SLAVERY, 4 RECONSTRUCTION, AND THE JIM CROW ERA; TWO ANTHROPOLOGISTS OR SOCIOLOGISTS WHO ARE 6 KNOWLEDGEABLE ABOUT AFRICAN AMERICAN CULTURE AND SOCIETY; TWO REPRESENTATIVES OF AFRICAN AMERICAN 7 8 ORGANIZATIONS; AND (IV) A MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC, WHO SHALL SERVE AS THE CHAIR 10 OF THE COMMISSION. 11 (E) (1) THE TERM OF AN APPOINTED MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION IS 4 12 YEARS. THE TERMS OF THE APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ARE 13 14 STAGGERED AS PROVIDED ON OCTOBER 1, 2000. AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A 15 16 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES. A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES 17 18 ONLY FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED 19 AND QUALIFIES. 20 (F) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION: 21 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 22 COMMISSION; BUT 23 IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE (2) 24 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET. THE MARYLAND HISTORICAL TRUST AND THE STATE ARCHIVES SHALL 25 (G) 26 PROVIDE FOR THE STAFFING OF THE COMMISSION. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the initial appointed 27 28 members of the Commission shall be appointed on or before October 1, 2000. 29 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the members of the 30 Commission appointed on or before October 1, 2000 shall be appointed to the 31 following terms: 32 three, including the individual appointed to chair the Commission, (1)
