16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
	MARYLAND, That:
18	(a) The Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration shall establish a 3-year pilot
19	program the Alcohol and Drug Treatment to Work Pilot Program in Baltimore City

- 10 (f) At the conclusion of the <u>pilot</u> program, the Administration shall submit a 11 report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government 12 Article, containing information <u>about the pilot program</u>, including:
- 13 (1) The number of participants and the training or employment to which 14 each participant was assigned;
- 15 (2) The current employment and training status of the participants;
- 16 (3) Any criminal activity of the participants; and
- 17 (4) Involvement of participants in outpatient drug and alcohol 18 treatment-; and
- 19 (g) Funding for this <u>pilot</u> program shall be included in the Administration's 20 annual budget.
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 22 October 1, 2000. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of
- 23 September 30, 2003, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 24 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
