## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

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## Health Care for All Marylanders

3 FOR the purpose of resolving that the Maryland General Assembly is committed to

4 implementing public policy that will provide affordable, quality health care

5 coverage for all Marylanders; resolving that, the Maryland General Assembly

6 encourages a public-private partnership in developing policies to provide health

7 care coverage for all Marylanders; resolving that there is a Panel on

8 Comprehensive Health Care; providing for the membership, leadership,

9 meetings, staffing, <u>reimbursement</u>, and charges of the Panel; <u>providing that the</u>

10 work of the Panel shall be funded as provided for in the State budget; requiring

11 the Panel to submit a certain report by a certain date; providing for the

12 termination of the Panel; and resolving that a copy of this resolution be

13 forwarded by the Department of Legislative Services to certain individuals.

WHEREAS, 837,000 Marylanders, or 16.6 percent of the population, are without
 health insurance coverage; and

WHEREAS, The number of uninsured people in Maryland increased by 160,000
 from 1997 to 1998; and

18 WHEREAS, In the last 10 years, the number of uninsured people in Maryland

19 has doubled, making Maryland's rate of increase in uninsured residents one of the 20 highest in the nation; and

21 WHEREAS, The number of uninsured Marylanders continues to increase,

22 despite an extended period of economic growth and increased employment and

1 despite the presence of State programs designed to provide health care coverage to 2 uninsured adults and children; and

WHEREAS, Health care insurance premiums are projected to rise nearly 10
 percent in the year 2000; now, therefore, be it
