SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning
- 2 **Postsecondary Secondary Career and Technology Education Programs**
- 3 FOR the purpose of stating the intent of the General Assembly to concur in placing
- 4 certain postsecondary secondary career and technology education programs in
- 5 the Maryland Unified Plan for Workforce Investment.
- 6 WHEREAS, Maryland has collaboratively developed a Unified Plan for
- 7 Workforce Investment to be submitted in April 2000 to the appropriate federal
- 8 agencies; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998 represents the
- 10 achievement of consensus on the need to restructure a multiplicity of workforce
- 11 development programs into an integrated workforce investment system that can
- 12 better respond to the employment needs of the business community in Maryland; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Maryland's current workforce demands exceed the number of
- 14 qualified workers available for employment; and
- WHEREAS, Collaboration among workforce partners in the State will increase
- 16 the ability to prepare more qualified workers to meet future employment demands;
- 17 and
- WHEREAS, The federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998 specifically allows a
- 19 unified plan under the requirements of Section 501(b)(1) of the Act; and
- WHEREAS, Postsecondary career and technology education programs
- 21 authorized by the federal Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Technical Education Act of
- 22 1998 are already included in the Maryland Unified Plan for Workforce Investment
- 23 without requiring legislative approval, and it is the understanding of the General

- 1 Assembly that the Governor has concurred with the inclusion of those programs in
- 2 the Unified Plan; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That it is the
- 4 intent of the General Assembly to state that it concurs with the decision to include
- 5 postsecondary secondary career and technology education programs in the Maryland
- 6 Unified Plan for Workforce Investment; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 8 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- $9\,$ the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
- 10 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
