## FISCAL NOTE Revised

House Bill 191 (Delegate Branch, et al.)

Commerce and Government Matters

Vehicle Laws - Baltimore City - Regulation of All-Terrain Vehicles - Minibikes, Mopeds, and Off-the-Road Motorcycles

This bill authorizes Baltimore City to regulate the operation of all-terrain vehicles, minibikes, mopeds, and off-the-road motorcycles within the boundaries of Baltimore City. Baltimore City may require such vehicles to be registered and may impose a registration fee.

### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

**Local Effect:** Potential increase in Baltimore City revenue from registration fees and fines related to registration violations. The cost of regulation could be handled within the existing resources of Baltimore City.

**Small Business Effect:** Minimal.

#### **Analysis**

**Bill Summary:** The bill defines an all-terrain vehicle as a self-propelled vehicle that: (1) is not more than 50 inches wide; (2) has a dry weight of not more than 600 pounds; (3) travels on at least three low pressure tires; and (4) is designed to carry only the operator of the vehicle on a seat or saddle designed to be straddled by the operator.

**Current Law:** There are no provisions specifically governing the use of all-terrain vehicles. However, in order to operate any type of motorized vehicle on a roadway, it must be registered with the Motor Vehicle Administration. All-terrain vehicles are not otherwise

required to be registered. Further, each county and Baltimore City may regulate the operation of off-the-road motorcycles and may require such vehicles to be registered and may impose a registration fee.
