### **Police and Court Records - Misidentification - Expungement**

This bill authorizes a person to petition for the expungement of State records if the person was misidentified because a defendant used the person's name as an alias. The bill authorizes such a petition to be filed immediately after discovery of the misidentification.

# **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** Minimal. The requirements of this bill could be accommodated with the existing budgeted resources of the Judiciary or other affected State agencies.

**Local Effect:** Minimal. The requirements of this bill could be accommodated with the existing budgeted resources of the circuit courts or Offices of State's Attorneys.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** There are eight circumstances under which a person may petition for expungement, including if the person is acquitted or if the person is convicted of only one non-violent crime and is granted a pardon by the Governor. The time frames for filing petitions vary by circumstance. A State's Attorney is allowed to file an objection to such a petition, and is also allowed to later access such records by petition, under specified circumstances, or by an *ex parte* order.
